Founded in 1974, OAR is a community-based nonprofit organization working with men and women returning to the community from incarceration and offering alternative sentencing options through community service to youth and adults. Additionally, race equity is a core goal at OAR, and we also seek to promote equity in the legal system and across all systems.

Who We Serve

OAR serves individuals and families of individuals incarcerated and/or returning from incarceration to Arlington County and the cities of Alexandria and Falls Church. We also serve individuals completing community service hours through the Arlington County and City of Falls Church courts.

Our Programs and Services

Reentry Services

• OAR provides pre-release programs inside local detention facilities and the closest prison releasing individuals to Arlington, Alexandria, and Falls Church including classes in essential wellness and personal growth, as well as case management, employment services, individual and group psychotherapy conducted by a group of licensed clinicians. Transition assistance, employment coaching, and case management are also provided to individuals currently and previously incarcerated and their families in hopes of a successful and safe reentry back into the community.

Community Service Program

Based on the restorative justice model, OAR's community service program
provides individuals with the opportunity to give back to their community
and provide a meaningful service for the greater benefit of all. OAR works
with the Arlington County and City of Falls Church courts to offer
community service as an alternative form of sentencing to keep individuals
out of incarceration and as a way for individuals to pay back court costs after
incarceration with limited resources.

Racial Equity and Inclusion*

 OAR has a long-standing tradition of pursuing justice. OAR's newest initiative will focus on engaging the community in a racial equity dialogue with the ultimate goal of creating a sense of urgency in implementing systemic solutions. OAR believes that the time for justice is always right now.
