
OAR is currently hosting a fundraiser to raise funds for our direct services programs for a grant we are applying to and we are calling on your support to help us reach **our goal of \$6,000** in order to move onto the next phase of the grant.

We are applying for a \$50,000 grant to expand our Direct Services fund to meet the increased needs of participants and their families. With these additional funds, we can provide even more meaningful wraparound assistance for individuals and families, helping to shape a safe reentry that includes economic, physical, mental, and emotional stability as well as strong family connections.

OAR is now in the next phase of this grant, which requires the organization to raise a minimum of \$6,000. Once we hit this fundraising goal, we can move on to the next round of the grant. Meet "Theodore"\*



Theodore was one of the many released from the Arlington County Detention Facility (ACDF) during the COVID-19 pandemic. Before his release from incarceration, Theodore regularly interacted with OAR through the groups that we facilitate for the residents in ACDF. Although he was nervous about getting released in the middle of a global pandemic, he felt a little more reassurance knowing that OAR would be with him to help him through his transition back home.

When Theodore was released in August 2020, he was highly determined to accomplish all the goals he set for himself. Through your support, OAR supported Theodore with transportation, helped retrieve his ID, provided him with a cell phone and a laptop, clothing for the summer and winter, food assistance, and enrolled Theodore in our employment program.

Through OAR's employment program, Theodore had the opportunity to practice mock interviews and submit applications. With all of his hard work and determination, he quickly landed a position at a local Goodwill. Theodore got off to a great start at his new job and consistently went above and beyond the requirements. He even got promoted to the lead position on his team in just weeks.

After getting hired from Goodwill, Theodore wrote back to OAR and told us, "the President of Goodwill just came to my store, and they called all of us in a huddle. At first, we thought someone got into trouble or something, but I come to find out that I got honored for having the highest production rate and electronic sales for all of the Goodwills in the D.C. metro area for this month! I was overwhelmed and got all emotional, and I'm still in shock because they are going to give me a bonus as well. I had to share that because it's people like you at OAR who continue to encourage us and push us, so I feel like that motivation carried over to my work ethic as well. It's all thanks to OAR for helping me get in the right direction."

With OAR's help with housing, Theodore could secure an apartment for himself and his children. He is still working and excelling at his job, and OAR is continuing to stay on the journey with Theodore in supporting him in all of his endeavors. We would not be able to do this without your continued love and support!

### Racial Justice and Liberation Virtual Cohorts - Register for the Sept-Nov 2021 Sessions Today!



We are now accepting applications for OAR's 3-Month Racial Justice and Liberation Virtual Cohorts for our September-November 2021 sessions. These virtual cohorts include a curriculum focusing on racial justice and liberation for all. Cohorts are separated between BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, and People of Color) and WP (White People).

The BIPOC Liberation cohort will take place on Thursdays from 1-4pm (EST) and the WP Dismantling Whiteness (for WP) cohort will take place on Mondays from 6-9pm (EST).

To participate in these virtual cohorts, you must have a working computer/laptop device with a video camera. If you are interested in participating in one of these upcoming cohorts, you must fill out the application online on the OAR website. If you are chosen to participate in one of the cohorts, the date, time, and payment invoice will be provided to you.

We would also like to share that if you have already participated in and graduated from any of the past cohort sessions, you are still eligible to register for another upcoming cohort session at <u>NO charge</u>. We are ever evolving and growing throughout each cohort session, which is why we are inviting all cohort graduates to join us. If you are a cohort graduate and would like to re-register for another session, there is now a section in our <u>registration form</u> to indicate this.

We also offer scholarships for individuals formerly incarcerated and personnel (sworn and civilian) in Law Enforcement, Corrections, Court and Judicial Services, Fire and Rescue, Public Safety Communications and Emergency Management. There is a section on the application form where you can apply for a scholarship.


In the past, OAR has collected new backpacks and school supplies for children and families impacted by incarceration. The pandemic allowed us to spruce up our liberation practices and center participants more deeply.

With that in mind the goal for this program is to provide each child with a \$50 gift card/e-gift card/cash/check/or direct deposit. This way, the families can choose to use these gift cards/funds for whatever they need. Along with each gift card, each child will also receive a letter from their parent experiencing incarceration, letting them know that the gift is coming from them and wishing them luck on the upcoming school year.

**Recommended Reads from OAR's Racial Justice Library** 



The recommended read for this month is, <u>Let's Get Free: A Hip-Hop Theory of Justice</u>, by Paul Butler. Drawing on his personal fascinating story as a prosecutor, a defendant, and an observer of the legal process, Butler offers a sharp and engaging critique of our criminal justice system. He argues against discriminatory drug laws and excessive police power and shows how our policy of mass incarceration erodes communities and perpetuates crime. Controversially, he supports jury nullification, or voting "not guilty" out of principle, as a way for everyday people to take a stand against unfair laws. Butler offers instead a "hip hop theory of justice," parsing the messages about crime and punishment found in urban music and culture. Butler's argument is powerful, edgy, and incisive.


#### **Project Connection (year-round)**


